Construction	Norcross Brothers of Worcester, Massachusetts
Laying of Cornerstone	November 21, 1911
First Worship Service	October 4, 1913
Consecration	April 25, 1916
Construction Cost	\$1,171,906.44
Exterior	Kentucky limestone from Bowling Green
Interior	Kentucky sandstone from South Carrollton
Choir Stalls, Pulpit, Lectern	Carved Oak
Extreme Width	100 feet
Extreme Length	214 feet
Width of Nave	43 feet between columns
Height of Nave	95 feet from pavement to vault
Pews	7 columns of pews (five in nave and two in chantry chapel) 40 pews in each column flanking the center aisle of the nave
Reredos	43 feet wide, 80 feet high, containing over 80 figures designed by sculptor Lee Lawrie and executed by Ardolino Brothers, Boston in Dunnville sandstone from near Downsville, WI
Rose Window	25 feet in diameter
Clerestory Windows	18 feet wide, 32 feet high
Chancel Organ	119 stops, 160 ranks, 8,916 pipes (ranging in length from the size of a pencil to thirty-two feet)
Gallery Organ	22 stops, 32 ranks, 1700 pipes
Bell Tower	15 stories high, housing 26 bells
