ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Theology Class. This Sunday, with the guidance of Fr. Matthew Moretz, we will continue to explore the theme of **"Wrath and Compassion"** in the Holy Scriptures. We will continue to look at the profound influence of Second Isaiah on the New Testament, and begin to look at the vivid symbol of "the cup of wrath" and how that relates to the meaning of Jesus' death and resurrection. The class meets at 10 a.m. on the fifth floor of the parish house.
