## ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

**Theology Class.** This Sunday, with the guidance of Fr. Matthew Moretz, we will explore the theme of **“Victims and Vindication.”** in the Holy Scriptures. After reviewing the book of Job, and reviewing the imagery of the “redeemer,” we will now look at the book of Jonah and how the figure of Jonah in the Gospels allows us a good entry point into the mindset of Jesus regarding victims and vindication. Next week, **Sunday, August 25**, our class will begin to explore the theme of **“Temple Theology.”** The class meets at 10 a.m. on the fifth floor of the parish house.
