The people stand at the entry of the choir and ministers and remain standing until the singing of the psalm.

The Blessing of Light

The Officiant greets the people with these words.

Light and peace, in Jesus Christ our Lord.

People Thanks be to God.

A minister reads a short passage of scripture.

JESUS said, "Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid. Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." *Matthew 5:14-16*

A flame is kindled and the Officiant then sings the Prayer for Light.

LESSED art thou, Lord our God, creator of day and night, to thee be glory and praise forever! Thou art our light and our salvation and we thy children wait for thy loving kindness in the midst of thy temple. In thy Son, Jesus Christ, born of the Blessed Virgin Mary, there hast sprung up a light for the righteous and joyful gladness for those that are faithful. As we, like Simeon and Anna, welcome him with joy, presented before us as the light of all the world, may we be filled with his Spirit and made into a living temple to the praise and glory of thy holy name. By that same light of Christ, thy living Word, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds that we may walk as children of light and sing thy praises, O Father, Son, and Holy Spirit to whom be all honor and glory, world without end. Amen.

Nursery: We welcome our youngest members and guests to Saint Thomas Church. Nursery care is available for infants and young children of parents attending the 9 and 11 a.m. liturgies. Registration is open for both Nursery and Sunday School using an online form found on the Saint Thomas website under Families/Sunday School. Today, all of our children will participate in the Candlemas Procession at 11 a.m. Our older children will then stay in Mass with their families to support Annabel, Raya and Mila who will receive their first Holy Communion today.

Communion classes. The final Communion class meets today at 9:30 a.m. in the Sunday School Room on the third floor of the Parish House.

A quiet area is available in the Chantry Chapel for **Children and Families** who wish to worship together. Accompanied young children are welcome to use this space during the 9 and 11 a.m. liturgies, where they are invited to enjoy a range of Bible stories and soft toys.

ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Theology Class. Today, at 10 a.m., on the fifth floor of the Parish House, Fr. Bennett and Fr. Brown will continue their series on the Classics of Christian Spirituality with a class on the 14th century mystic Julian of Norwich. Dame Julian's book, *The Revelations of Divine Love*, is one of the great works on the spiritual life. It is also thought to be the oldest surviving book in English to have been written by a woman. Next Sunday, February 9, we will welcome a guest instructor, Ann Satterfield. Ms. Satterfield will teach an introductory class on Christian prayer entitled, "A Spectrum of Prayer" in which four types of prayer will be discussed.
