MUSIC NOTES

The music of Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina has historically been viewed as the epitome of Renaissance polyphony. A prolific composer, Palestrina wrote 105 masses and more than 300 motets. The *Missa Lauda Sion* derives its melodic material from the Sequence Lauda Sion Salvatorem, a hymn celebrating the doctrine of transubstantiation. This hymn can be found in the Hymnal 1982, number 320.

A quiet area is available in the Chantry Chapel for **Children and Families** who wish to worship together. Accompanied young children are welcome to use this space during the 9 and 11 a.m. liturgies, where they are invited to enjoy a range of Bible stories and soft toys.

ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Theology Class. Today, at 10 a.m., on the fifth floor of the Parish House, Fr. Spencer begins a two-part series on "**The Spirituality of Saint Ignatius Loyola**," the sixteenth-century founder of Jesuit order. In the first class of the series, Fr.
