
Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

BENEDICTION

The Officiant blesses the people with the Blessed Sacrament.

THE DIVINE PRAISES

The people repeat each line after the priest.

Blessed be his holy Name.

Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God and true man.

Blessed be the Name of Jesus.

Blessed be his most Sacred Heart.

Blessed be his most Precious Blood.

Blessed be Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.

Blessed be the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete.

Blessed be the great Mother of God, Mary most Holy.

Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother.

Blessed be St. Joseph, her most chaste spouse.

Blessed be God in his angels and in his saints.

Blessed be God in the hearts of his faithful people.

REPOSITION

As the Sacrament is reposed, Psalm 150 is sung

PSALM 150

PRAISE God in his holiness:* praise him in the firmament of his power.

- 2 Praise him in his noble acts:* praise him according to his excellent greatness.
- 3 Praise him in the sound of the trumpet:* praise him upon the lute and harp.
- 4 Praise him in the timbrels and dances:* praise him upon the strings and pipe.
- 5 Praise him upon the well-tuned cymbals:* praise him upon the loud cymbals.
- 6 Let every thing that hath breath* praise the Lord.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son,* and to the Holy Ghost; As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be,* world without end. Amen.
