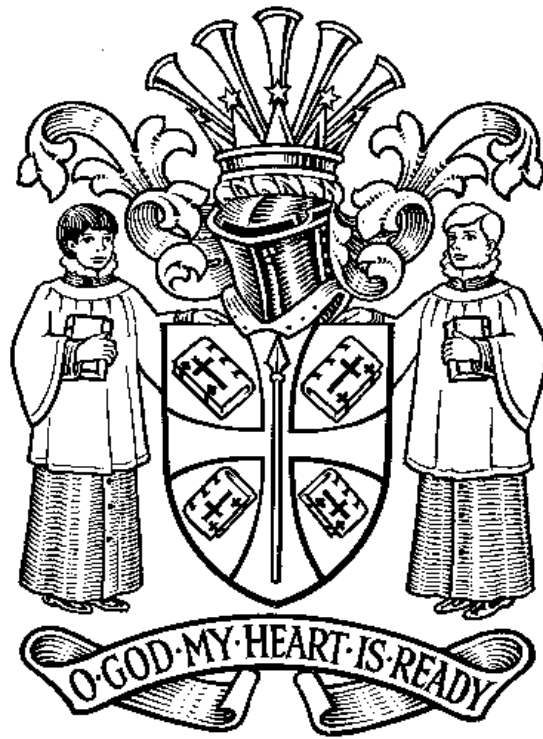





ADMISSION OF HEAD AND DEPUTY HEAD CHORISTERS

The People sit. The Choir and ministers remain standing. The Rector and Head of School stand at the top of the Chancel steps. The Director of Music presents the Boys for admission to the Rector, saying

REVEREND Father, I present to you Fernando Morel to be admitted as Head Chorister, and William Petretta to be admitted as Deputy Head Chorister of this Church of Saint Thomas Fifth Avenue.

The Rector addresses those to be admitted

Do you desire to be admitted as Head Choristers of this Church?

The Rector says

The Rector takes the hand of the Head Chorister and says

The Rector takes the hand of the Deputy Head Choristers and says

I admit you, William, as Deputy Head Chorister of this Church in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

As Vicar and Chief Operating Officer of our Church, he will assist the Rector and the Vestry of this Church in fulfilling its mission to worship, love and serve our Lord Jesus Christ through the Anglican Tradition and our unique choral heritage. As the senior member of staff under the Rector, Matthew will be charged with the continuing implementation of the strategic plan across the parish and the Choir School. I commend this ministry to you, the people of this parish, and ask you to support Matthew in all his endeavors done in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Matthew, will you endeavor to undertake this new responsibility to the best of your ability?

He descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again.
He ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

Celebrant Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread,

repent and return to the Lord?

People I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

Celebrant Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you strive for justice and peace among all people,
and respect the dignity of every human being?

People I will, with God's help.

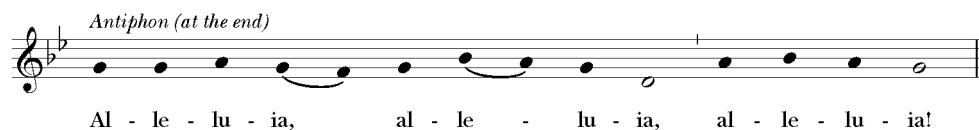
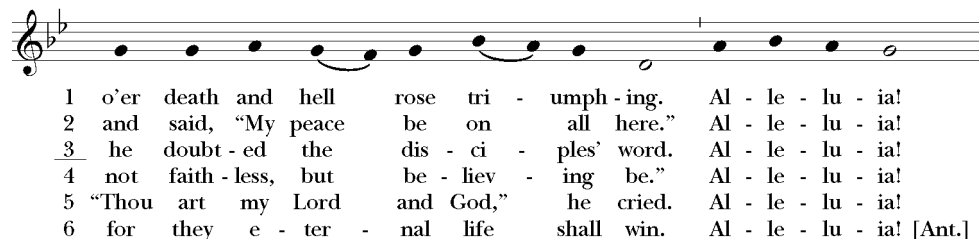
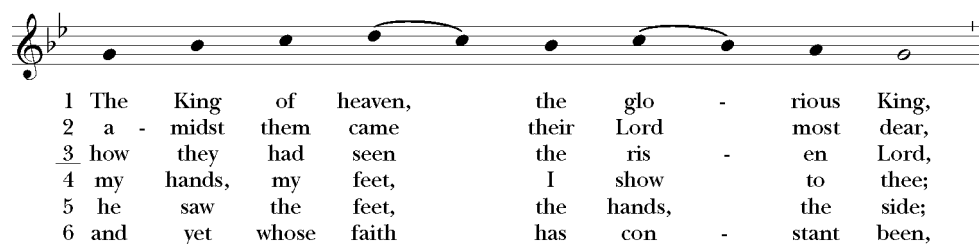
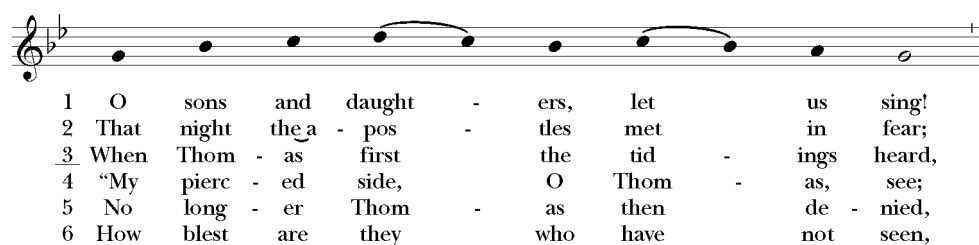
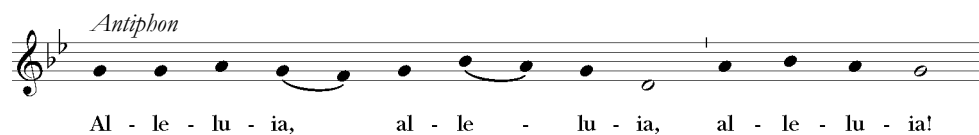
PROCESSION TO THE ICON OF SAINT THOMAS
