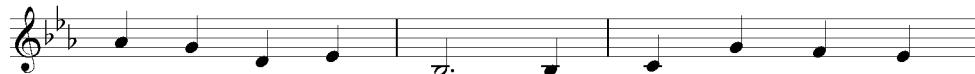

The Rector

THE NICENE CREED

And I believe in the Holy Ghost, The Lord, and Giver of Life, Who proceedeth from the Father and the Son; Who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified; Who spake by the Prophets: And I believe one holy Catholic and Apostolic Church: I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins: And I look for the Resurrection of the dead: And the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE (FORM II)

I ask your prayers for peace; for goodwill among nations; and for the well-being of all people.
Pray for justice and peace.

Silence

I ask your prayers for all in authority; for our President, for the Governor of the State of New York, and for the Mayor of the City of New York. For the Police Department, the Fire Department of New York, all paramedics and first-responders, and for all who work in the front line in our hospitals.
Pray for all who serve the community.

Silence

I ask your prayers for an end to prejudice and violence; for those who protest peacefully in the cause of justice; for all striving to end the sin of racism in our world.
Pray for the Beloved Community.

Silence

I ask your prayers for the poor, the sick, the hungry, the oppressed, and those in prison. For all who suffer from famine, drought, or disease.
Pray for those in any need or trouble.

Silence

I ask your prayers for all who seek God, or a deeper knowledge of him.
Pray that they may find and be found by him.

Silence

I ask your prayers for our Choir School. For Amy, our Interim Head of School; for Christopher Seeley our Head of School Designate, and all the faculty and staff. For the choristers and their families. For the Alumni Association, the Choir School Committee, and all who support our Choir School.
Pray that we may all sing to the Lord a new song.

Silence

I ask your prayers for the departed especially those who have died violently, or who have taken their own lives, and for family, friends, and neighbors who have died during the Pandemic.
Pray for those who have died.

Silence

Praise God for those in every generation in whom Christ has been honored especially the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, Saint Thomas our Patron, all whom we remember today.
Pray that we may have grace to glorify Christ in our own day.

Silence

After a period of silence, the Celebrant concludes with this collect

HEAVENLY Father, thou hast promised to hear what we ask in the Name of thy Son: Accept and fulfill our petitions, we pray, not as we ask in our ignorance, nor as we deserve in our sinfulness, but as thou knowest and lovest us in your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*
