The Director of Music vests the new Chorister with a surplice and then hands to the Vicar a Hymnal.

The Vicar hands the Hymnal to the newly admistted Chorister, saying

Remember always that what you sing with your lips, you should believe in your heart, and what you believe in your heart, you should practice in your life. *Amen*.

When all have been admitted, the Vicar says

Let us pray.


