Word, and to ask those things which are requisite and necessary, as well for the body as the soul.
Wherefore I pray and beseech you, as many as are here present, to accompany me with a pure heart,
and humble voice unto the throne of the heavenly grace, saying with me:

THE GENERAL CONFESSION


