At the foot of the cross of Christ stood his mother, and from the cross she received his lifeless body in her arms. Give comfort and healing to all who suffer and all who watch the suffering of those they love.

He hath filled the hungry with good things, People and the rich he hath sent empty away.

> The apostle John saw a vision of a woman in heaven, robed with the sun. Bring us with all those who have died in the faith of Christ to share the joy of heaven with Mary and all the saints.

He remembering his mercy hath holpen his servant Israel, People as he promised to our forefathers, Abraham and his seed for ever.

In a moment of quiet, let us bring our own prayers to the Lord.


