

THE ADMISSION OF A CHORISTER

The People remain seated. The Choir and Ministers stand. The Head of School presents the chorister for admission to the Rector, saying

Reverend Father, I present to you Dominic Scarozza, to be admitted a Chorister of this Church of Saint Thomas Fifth Avenue.

The Rector says

Do you desire to be admitted a Chorister of this Church?

The Chorister answer

I do.

Taking the Chorister's hand, the Rector says

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, I admit you, Dominic, as a Chorister of this Church. Amen.

The Director of Music vests the new Chorister with a surplice and then hands the Rector a Hymnal.

The Rector hands the Hymnal to the newly admitted Chorister, saying

Remember always that what you sing with your lips, you should believe in your heart, and what you believe in your heart, you should practice in your life. *Amen.*

The Rector then says

Let us pray.

The People stand.

ALMIGHTY and everlasting God, who makes us both to will and to do those things that are good and acceptable unto thee: We offer our prayers to thee for thy servant here present, and more especially for him who has now been admitted to a place in the Choir of this Church. Let thy fatherly hand ever be over him; let thy Holy Spirit ever be with him; and so lead him in the knowledge and obedience of thy holy word that, in the end, he may obtain everlasting life; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who with thee and the Holy Spirit liveth and reigneth ever, one God, world without end. **Amen.**
