## THE NICENE CREED

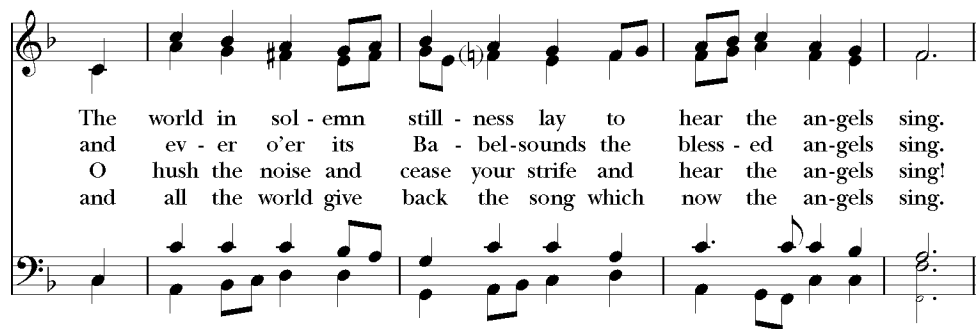
