



The Collect of the Day

The Celebrant sings

The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Celebrant Let us pray.

Silence is kept. The Celebrant says the Collect.

Father in heaven, who at the baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan proclaimed him your beloved Son and anointed him with the Holy Spirit: Grant that all who are baptized into his Name may keep the covenant they have made, and boldly confess him as Lord and Savior; who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, in glory everlasting. **Amen.**

The People sit.

The Lesson Genesis 1:1-5

Lector The word of the Lord.

People Thanks be to God.

Psalm 29

The Cantor sings the refrain and all repeat.



May the Lord bless his peo-ple with peace.

Ascribe to the Lord, O heavenly beings, ascribe to the Lord glory and strength. Ascribe to the Lord the glory of his name; worship the Lord in holy splendor. *Refrain*

The voice of the Lord is over the waters; the God of glory thunders, the Lord, over mighty waters.

The voice of the Lord is powerful; the voice of the Lord is full of majesty. *Refrain*

The voice of the Lord breaks the cedars; the Lord breaks the cedars of Lebanon. He makes Lebanon skip like a calf, and Sirion like a young wild ox. *Refrain*

The voice of the Lord flashes forth flames of fire.

The voice of the Lord shakes the wilderness; the Lord shakes the wilderness of Kadesh. *Refrain*

The voice of the Lord causes the oaks to whirl, and strips the forest bare; and in his temple all say, "Glory!" *Refrain*

The Lord sits enthroned over the flood; the Lord sits enthroned as king forever.

May the Lord give strength to his people!

May the Lord bless his people with peace! *Refrain*

Cantor God was revealed in flesh, vindicated in Spirit, seen by angels, Proclaimed among Gentiles, believed in throughout the world, taken up in glory.

All repeat the Alleluia.

The Priest reads the Gospel, first saying

People Praise to you, Lord Christ.

The Homily Mother Lee-Pae

The Prayers of the People (Form IV)

The Leader says

Let us pray for the Church and for the world.

The People remain standing. This response is used after each petition

Lord, in your mercy.

People Hear our prayer.

After the prayers, silence is kept, then the Celebrant adds a concluding Collect.

Eternal Father, you gave to your incarnate Son the holy name of Jesus to be the sign of our salvation: Plant in every heart, we pray, the love of him who is the Savior of the world, our Lord Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, in glory everlasting.



The Invitation to Communion


The Celebrant says
