Sermon Outline

Under the Old Covenant only the *High Priest* was permitted into the **inner sanctuary** (beyond the second curtain) to atone for his own and his family's sins. The New Covenant brings a **new order** (v. 10): *Christ as High Priest* provides the one perfect sacrifice effective for *eternal liberation/redemption* (v. 12). Being without blemish His sacrifice achieves an inward cleansing for all God's people in Christ. 'For if the blood of goats and bulls ...sanctifies those who have been defiled..., how much more will the blood of Christ, who offered himself without blemish to God, purify our conscience from dead works to worship the living God!" (Hebrews 9:13-14). What a declaratory statement and question!

We are a people most blessed by our High Priest, Jesus Christ! A sacrifice need no longer be made each year, for Jesus of Nazareth, our great High Priest, "entered once," and only once, for all, thus securing an eternal redemption" (v. 12). What a Saviour! We are redeemed for ever, because "You died; and now your life lies hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, who is our life, is revealed, then you too will be revealed with him in glory" (Colossians 3:3-4).

Yes, we can never be un-redeemed. This redemption is not for a season; it is an **eternal redemption for the world.** (Hebrews 9:13-15). How?

- By what Jesus Christ did: He offered HIMSELF willingly as pure Gift.
- By who he is: The Christ (The Lord) "Predestined before the foundation of the world" (1 Peter 1:20).
- By what he longs to do with members of his Body on earth: Cleansing and purifying our conscience to serve the living God (v. 14b). How? By filling us with the Holy Spirit **DAILY**! For he is the living vine in whom we live.
- With such amazing love, that I must respond by serving him. And together we make him VISIBLE by being salt and light for all the world.
- With such amazing love, that we must all serve him.
 How? By desiring to dwell in the Life of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
 And asking that he grafts in us the GIFT of service, self-denial and sacrifice.
 For "we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the life of good deeds, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life" (Ephesians 2:10). Our DNA as redeemed children of God by Adoption and Grace is to live a Jesus Christ Shaped Life.

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

The Celebrant says

The People remain kneeling until the bell rings.

AN ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION (for those unable to receive Holy Communion)

BELIEVE in thee, O my Jesus, present in the most holy Sacrament of the Altar; I love thee above all things, and I desire to receive thee into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive thee sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace thee, and I unite myself to thee as if thou wast already there. Never permit me to be separated from thee!

O Lord Jesus Christ, let the sweet and consuming force of thy love absorb my whole soul, that I may die for the love of thee, who wast pleased to die for the love of me. Amen.

Amen.
