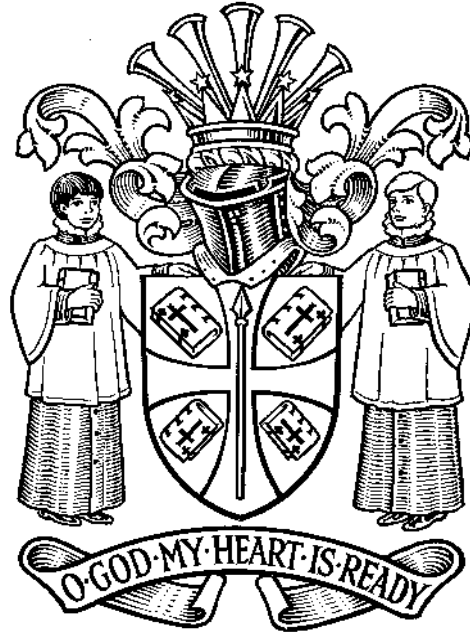

Help us entrust our brothers and sisters to thy never-failing care and love. Receive them into the arms of thy mercy, and remember them according to the favor thou bearest for thy people.


