The Rector addresses those to be admitted

Do you desire to be admitted as Head Choristers of this Church?

Answer I do.

The Rector says

Do you promise to set a good example, show respect to those in authority, and encourage your fellow choristers to offer their best to God and to the Choir School?

Answer I do.

The Rector takes the hand of the Head Chorister and says

I admit you, Elias Jeon, as Head Chorister of this Church in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Rector places the medal around his neck and says

Receive this medal as a badge of your office; may it remind you that what you sing with your lips, you should believe in your heart, and practice and show forth in your life.

The Rector takes the hand of the Deputy Head Choristers and says

I admit you, William Lee, as Deputy Head Chorister of this Church in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Rector places the medal around his neck and says

Receive this medal as a badge of your office; may it remind you that what you sing with your lips you should believe in your heart, and practice and show forth in your life.

The Rector says this prayer

S ING, rejoice and be glad; praise the Lord with a merry voice. May God grant you grace so to worship and serve him on earth, that you may praise him eternally among the saints in heaven; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit be amongst you and remain with you always. **Amen.**

The Head and Deputy Head Chorister now bring the Probationer to be admitted to the Head of School.

ADMISSION OF A NEW CHORISTER

The Choir and Ministers stand; The People remain seated. The Head of School presents the Probationer for admission to the Rector, saying

Reverend Father, I present to you Royce Jung, to be admitted as a Chorister of this Church of Saint Thomas Fifth Avenue.

The Rector asks the Boy to be admitted the following

Do you desire to be admitted as a Chorister of this Church?

The Boy answers

I do.

Taking the Probationer's hand, the Rector says

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, I admit you, Royce, as a Chorister of this Church. Amen.

The Director of Music vests the new Chorister with a surplice and then hands to the Rector a Hymnal.

The Rector hands the Hymnal to the newly admitted Chorister, saying

Remember always that what you sing with your lips, you should believe in your heart, and what you believe in your heart, you should practice in your life. Amen.

After the Probationer has been admitted, the Head and Deputy Head Chorister take the admitted Chorister to his place in the Choir stalls and say,

Pursuant to a decree of the Venerable Rector and Vestry of Saint Thomas Church Fifth Avenue, we install you, Royce, as a Chorister of this Church.

The Head and Deputy Head Chorister take their places in the Choir stalls.

The Rector says

Let us pray.

The People stand.

A LMIGHTY and everlasting God, who makes us both to will and to do those things that are good and acceptable unto thee: We offer our prayers to thee for thy servants here present, and more especially for Royce who has now been admitted to a place in the Choir of this Church. Let thy fatherly hand ever be over him; let thy Holy Spirit ever be with him; and so lead him in the knowledge and obedience of thy holy word that, in the end, he may obtain everlasting life; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who with thee and the Holy Spirit liveth and reigneth ever, one God, world without end. 
