WELCOME TO SAINT THOMAS CHURCH FIFTH AVENUE

In the Western churches, the Epiphany (a word that means 'manifestation') became an occasion to celebrate one element in the story of Christ's birth - the visit of the far-travelled magi, understood as the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. Matthew's account speaks simply of 'wise men from the east'; later tradition fixed their number at three, made them kings and recalled their resonant names – Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. In the Eastern churches, the Epiphany is, rather, a celebration of three manifestations of Christ's glory – the visit of the wise men, his baptism in the River Jordan, and the miracle of Cana in Galilee, where Jesus 'first manifested his glory.'

Manifest at Jordan's stream, Prophet, Priest, and King supreme; and at Cana wedding-guest in thy Godhead manifest. (Christopher Wordsworth)

The season of joyful celebration that begins at Christmas continues through the successive Sundays of Epiphany, and the festal cycle ends only with the Feast of the Presentation, also known as Candlemas.

This afternoon, we will hear the reading of the Wedding at Cana in Galilee at which Jesus was a guest with his Mother and his disciples. During the service, married couples will be invited to renew their marriage vows together; we hope that you are inspired by this worship and that, at the beginning of a New Year, all married couples are strengthened in their relationships.

THE RENEWAL OF MARRIAGE VOWS

The Officiant says

X E have come together in the presence of God to give thanks for the gift of marriage, to ask his forgiveness for all that has been amiss, to rejoice together, and to ask for God's blessing. As our Lord Jesus Christ was himself a guest at the wedding in Cana of Galilee, so through his Spirit he is with us now. Marriage is a gift of God in creation and a means of his grace; it is given that a husband and wife may comfort and help each other, living faithfully together in times of need as well as in plenty, in sadness and in joy, in sickness and in health; it is given that with delight and tenderness they may know each other in love.



It is given as the foundation of family life in which children may be born and nurtured in accordance with God's will, to his praise and glory. In marriage a couple belong together and live life in the community; it is a way of life created and hallowed by God, that all should honor. Therefore we pray with those who have come to renew their vows that, strengthened and guided by God, they may continue to fulfil his purpose for their life together.

SILENT REFLECTION

Silence is kept for reflection on the years that have passed and on shared experiences, good and bad.

The Officiant says

I invite those married couples present in church and on-line to recall the vows that you made on your wedding day.

The couples who wish to renew their vows stand, and turn to face each other and hold hands.

The couples repeat after the Officiant:

I, Name, took you, Name, to be my husband/wife to have and to hold from that day forward, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, till death us do part, according to God's holy law, and this was our solemn vow. Today, in the presence of our family and friends, we affirm our continuing commitment to this vow.

Will you, the family and friends of our brothers and sisters who have now renewed their vows continue to support and uphold them in their marriage now and in the years to come?
