THE LITURGY OF LIGHT

The Procession arrives at the doors of the church. The Celebrant knocks on the door signaling the beginning of the Liturgy. The People stand and face the Narthex, where the New Fire has been kindled.

The Celebrant says

EAR Friends in Christ: On this most holy night, in which our Lord Jesus passed over from death to life, the Church invites her members, dispersed throughout the world, to gather in vigil and prayer. For this is the Passover of the Lord, in which by hearing his Word and celebrating his Sacraments, we share in his victory over death.

Let us pray.

GOD, through thy Son thou hast bestowed upon thy people the brightness of thy light: Sanctify this new fire, and grant that in this Paschal feast we may so burn with heavenly desires, that with pure minds we may attain to the festival of everlasting light; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE PREPARATION OF THE PASCHAL CANDLE

The Celebrant marks a Cross into the Paschal Candle and then outlines the letters of the Greek alphabet – Alpha and Omega – and the numerals of the current year, saying:

HRIST yesterday and today.
The Beginning and the End.
Alpha and Omega.
His are the times and ages.
To him be glory and dominion through all the ages of eternity. Amen.

The Celebrant inserts five grains of incense, saying:

THROUGH his holy and glorious wounds may Christ the Lord guard and preserve us. Amen.

The Celebrant lights the Paschal Candle saying:

May the light of Christ gloriously rising scatter the darkness of heart and mind.

THE PROCESSION AND DISTRIBUTION OF LIGHT

The Deacon, bearing the Paschal Candle, leads the procession into the dark church to the chancel, pausing three times and singing



At the second and third time, the Versicle and Response is sung successively higher in pitch.



Candles which have been distributed to the People are lighted during this Procession of Light.


The Paschal Candle is placed in its stand and honored with incense.

The People remain standing for the ancient chant Exsultet – the Proclamation of the Resurrection.

The People keep their candles lit until after the Gospel Reading.

THE EXSULTET Plainsong

REJOICE now, heavenly hosts and choirs of angels, and let your trumpets shout Salvation for the victory of our mighty King. Rejoice and sing now, all the round earth, bright with a glorious splendor, for darkness hath been vanquished by our eternal King. Rejoice and be glad now, Mother Church, and let thy holy courts in radiant light resound with the praises of thy people. All ye who stand near this marvelous holy flame, pray with me to God the Almighty for the grace to sing the worthy praise of this great light; through Jesus Christ his Son our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with him, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end. Amen.



It is very meet and right, at all times and in all places, with our whole heart and mind and voice that we should praise thee, the Invisible, Almighty and Eternal God, and thine only-begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ: For he is the very Paschal Lamb, who at the Feast of the Passover paid for us the debt of Adam's sin, and delivered by his Blood thy faithful people.

THIS is the night, when thou didst bring our fathers, the children of Israel, out of bondage in Egypt, and led them through the Red Sea on dry land. This is the night, when all who believe in Christ are delivered from the shadow of sin, and are restored to grace and holiness of life.

THIS is the night when Christ broke the bonds of death and hell, and rose victorious from the grave. How wonderful and beyond our knowing, O God, is thy mercy and loving kindness to us: that to redeem a slave, thou gavest a Son. O happy fault: O necessary sin of Adam which gained for us so great a Redeemer! How holy is this night, when wickedness is put to flight and sin is washed away. It restoreth innocence to the fallen, and joy to those who mourn. It casteth out pride and hatred, and bringeth peace and concord. How blessed is this night, when earth and heaven are joined, and man is reconciled to God.

HOLY Father, accept our evening sacrifice, the offering of this candle in thine honor. Though its light is divided into many parts, it shineth undimmed, for it is fed by melting wax wrought by the bee thy servant. May it shine continually to drive away all darkness. May Christ, the Morning Star who knoweth no setting, find it ever burning: he who giveth his light to all creation.



E beseech thee, O Lord, to direct, sanctify and govern us thy servants, and all thy faithful family, with thy continual grace; that we may pass our time in peace and gladness, in the festival of our redemption; through the same Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

The Celebrant says

Let us hear the record of God's saving deeds in history, how he saved his people in ages past; and let us pray that our God will bring each of us to the fullness of redemption.

The People sit.

DEUS NOSTER REFUGIUM

GoD is our hope and strength: a very present help in trouble.

Therefore will we not fear, though the earth be moved:
and though the hills be carried into the midst of the sea;

Though the waters thereof rage and swell:
and though the mountains shake at the tempest of the same.

The rivers of the flood thereof shall make glad the city of God:
the holy place of the tabernacle of the most Highest.

God is in the midst of her, therefore shall she not be removed : God shall help her, and that right early.

CANTICLE Plainsong (Tone IV^4)

CANTEMUS DOMINO

WILL sing unto the Lord, for he hath triumphed gloriously: the horse and his rider hath he thrown into the sea. The Lord is my strength and song, and he is become my salvation. He is my God, and I will prepare him an habitation; my father's God, and I will exalt him. The Lord is a man of war: the Lord is his name.

A period of silence is kept, following which all stand for the Collect.

COLLECT

GOD, whose wonderful deeds of old shineth forth even to our own day, thou deliverest by the power of thy mighty arm thy chosen people from slavery under Pharaoh, to be a sign for us of the salvation of all nations by the water of Baptism:

Grant that all the peoples of the earth may be numbered among the offspring of Abraham, and rejoice in the inheritance of Israel; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

A New Heart and a New Spirit Ezekiel 36:24-28



PSALM 42:1-7 Plainsong (Tone III⁴)

QUEMADMODUM

Like as the hart desireth the water-brooks: so longeth my soul after thee, O God. My soul is athirst for God, yea, even for the living God: when shall I come to appear before the presence of God?

My tears have been my meat day and night: while they daily say unto me, Where is now thy God? Now when I think thereupon, I pour out my heart by myself:

for I went with the multitude, and brought them forth into the house of God; In the voice of praise and thanksgiving: among such as keep holy-day.

Why art thou so full of heaviness, O my soul: and why art thou so disquieted within me? Put thy trust in God: for I will yet give him thanks for the help of his countenance.

A period of silence is kept, following which all stand for the Collect.

COLLECT

A LMIGHTY and everlasting God, who in the Paschal mystery established the new covenant of reconciliation: Grant that all who are reborn into the fellowship of Christ's Body may show forth in their lives what they profess by their faith; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Valley of Dry Bones Ezekiel 37:1-14

PSALM 143:1-6 Plainsong (Tone VII¹)

DOMINE, EXAUDTI

HEAR my prayer, O Lord, and consider my desire : hearken unto me for thy truth and righteousness' sake.

And enter not into judgement with thy servant: for in thy sight shall no man living be justified.

For the enemy hath persecuted my soul; he hath smitten my life down to the ground:

he hath laid me in the darkness, as the men that have been long dead.

Therefore is my spirit vexed within me: and my heart within me is desolate.

Yet do I remember the time past; I muse upon all thy works:

yea, I exercise myself in the works of thy hands.

I stretch forth my hands unto thee: my soul gaspeth unto thee as a thirsty land.

A period of silence is kept, following which all stand for the Collect.

COLLECT

GOD of unchangeable power and eternal light: Look favorably on thy whole Church, that wonderful and sacred mystery; by the effectual working of thy providence, carry out in tranquillity the plan of salvation; let the whole world see and know that things which were cast down are being raised up, and things which had grown old are being made new, and that all things are being brought to their perfection by him through whom all things were made, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.



HOLY BAPTISM

The Paschal Candle is taken from its stand to the Baptismal Font. The People remain standing.

ANTIPHON Plainsong (Mode II)

MNES qui in Christo baptizati estis, Christum induistis.
Afferte Domino, filii Dei: afferte Domino filios arietum.
Afferte Domino gloriam et honorem, afferte Domino gloriam nomini ejus: adorate Dominum in atrio sancto ejus.

For as many of you as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ.

Bring unto the Lord, O ye mighty, bring young rams unto the Lord: ascribe unto the Lord worship and strength.

Give the Lord the honour due unto his Name: worship the Lord with holy worship.

Galatians 3:27 and Psalm 29:1-2

At the Font, the Celebrant says

DEAR Friends, through the Paschal mystery, we are buried with Christ by Baptism into his death, and raised with him to newness of life. I call upon you, therefore, now that our Lenten observance is ended, to renew the solemn promises and vows of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and all his works, and promised to serve God faithfully, as we receive our dear brothers and sisters into his holy Catholic Church by Baptism.

THE PRESENTATION AND EXAMINATION OF THE CANDIDATES

The Celebrant says

The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

The People sit.

Adults and Older Children

The candidates who are able to answer for themselves are presented individually by their Sponsors

Sponsor I present N. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

The Celebrant asks each candidate when presented

Do you desire to be baptized?

The Candidate responds

I do.



Infants and Younger Children

The candidates who are unable to answer for themselves are presented individually by their Parents and Godparents

Parents and Godparents

I present N. to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

When all have been presented, the Celebrant asks the Parents and Godparents

Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

The Parents and Godparents respond

I will, with God's help.

The Celebrant says

Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

The Parents and Godparents respond

I will, with God's help.

Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the Candidates who can speak for themselves, and of the Parents and Godparents who speak on behalf of the infants and younger children

Question Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Question Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Answer I do.

Question Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer I do.

Question Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Answer I do.

The People stand and the Celebrant addresses the congregation

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

People We will.

Celebrant Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ

and renew our own baptismal covenant.



THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Father?

People I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Celebrant Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit

and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness

of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Celebrant Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People I will, with God's help.

Celebrant Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People I will, with God's help.

PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATES

The Celebrant then says to the congregation

Let us now pray for these persons who are to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

People Lord, hear our prayer.

Minister Open their hearts to thy grace and truth.

People Lord, hear our prayer.

Minister Fill them with thy holy and life-giving Spirit.

People Lord, hear our prayer.

Minister Keep them in the faith and communion of thy holy Church.

People Lord, hear our prayer.

Minister Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit.

People Lord, hear our prayer.

Minister Send them into the world in witness to thy love.

People Lord, hear our prayer.



Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ thy Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who liveth and reigneth now and for ever. **Amen.**

THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER



We thank thee, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it thou leddest the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it thy Son Jesus received the Baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life. We thank thee, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to thy Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Now sanctify this water, we pray thee, by the power of thy Holy Spirit, [this is repeated three times as the Paschal Candle is dipped into the water, then the Celebrant breathes the Greek letter Ψ (Psi) over the water] that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to thee, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. Amen.

THE BAPTISM

Each Candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant who then pours water upon the Candidate, saying:

N., I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.



THE ANOINTING WITH THE HOLY CHRISM

The Celebrant prays over the newly baptized, saying

EAVENLY Father, we thank thee that by water and the Holy Spirit thou hast bestowed upon these thy servants the forgiveness of sins, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in thy Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love thee, and the gift of joy and wonder in all thy works. Amen.

The Celebrant places his hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross with the Holy Chrism and saying to each one

N., you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. Amen.

THE GIVING OF THE LIGHTED CANDLE

A candle is lit from the Paschal Candle and given to the newly baptized or their parents. A Minister says

RECEIVE the light of Christ, so that when the bridegroom comes you may go forth with all the saints to meet him; and see that you keep the grace of your Baptism. Amen.

THE WELCOME


The Celebrant says

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

People We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.





The Celebrant continues

T is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto thee, O Lord, holy Father, almighty, everlasting God.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, he took bread; and when he had given thanks, he brake it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink ye all of this; for this is my Blood of the New Testament, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me."

HEREFORE, O Lord and heavenly Father, according to the institution of thy dearly beloved Son our Savior Jesus Christ, we, thy humble servants, do celebrate and make here before thy divine Majesty, with these thy holy gifts, which we now offer unto thee, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; rendering unto thee most hearty thanks for the innumerable benefits procured unto us by the same.

A ND we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us; and, of thy almighty goodness, vouchsafe to bless and sanctify, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, these thy gifts and creatures of bread and wine; that we, receiving them according to thy Son our Savior Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood.



A ND we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant that, by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we, and all thy whole Church, may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee that we, and all others who shall be partakers of this Holy Communion, may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction, and made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him.

And although we are unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service, not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offenses, through Jesus Christ our Lord;




